New legislation will safeguard Canadian mining resources and energy infrastructure from foreign interference

As part of the government's plan to protect Ontario, the province is introducing new measures to prevent foreign governments or corporations from claiming Ontario's critical minerals or participating in the province's energy sector. Stephen Lecce, Minister of Energy and Mines, along with Kevin Holland, MPP for Thunder Bay-Atikokan announced details from the Protect Ontario by Unleashing our Economy Act. The proposed legislation will safeguard Ontario's critical mining resources and energy infrastructure from hostile foreign actors and regimes, creating conditions that will attract investment and make Ontario's and Canada's economy more resilient and self-reliant.

"Canadian resources ought to benefit Canadians, not hostile, foreign regimes," said Minister Lecce. "In today's changing world, we need to be clear-eyed about the risks from those who want to exploit our resource bounty. That is why it is essential that Ontario is protecting our critical minerals and energy sector from getting into the wrong hands. Our government is taking action to secure our supply chains, from exploration to extraction, to ensure Canadian interests, jobs, and sovereignty always prevail."

Currently, there are no safeguards in place to prevent adversarial foreign governments or corporations or bad actors from claiming critical minerals or participating in the energy sector in Ontario. This means that foreign entities can stake claim to mineralrich deposits without the intention of harvesting them for the benefit of Ontarians or Canadians.

"Ontario is taking important actions to protect our mining and energy assets during this volatile time," said MPP Kevin Holland. "This is especially important for Northern Ontario, as critical mineral and mining resources are an integral part of our economy. This legislation will ensure they remain a commodity that supports our workforce and livelihood."

Protecting Ontario's Critical Minerals and Energy Sector



The Protect Ontario by Unleashing our Economy Act seeks to preserve and prioritize access to the province's critical minerals and energy sector by creating new measures that will allow the government to suspend or remove a registrant from the Mining Lands Administration System (MLAS) or suspend the MLAS system itself. It would also give the government the ability to deny the transfer or lease of a mining claim, or when necessary, revoke a mining claim registration or terminate a

New measures will also be taken to protect Ontario's essential energy usage by foreign state-owned or based companies by limiting the participation of specified foreign jurisdictions or entities in Ontario's energy sector. This aims to protect our energy systems from risks including malware, manipulation, tampering, surveillance, potential ratepayer harm, and other threats posed by foreign state-owned or based companies seeking to compromise essential services.

Quick Facts The 2021 report

'Foreign Interference Threats to Canada's Democratic Process' specifically noted that Canada's abundance of natural resources makes it a target for foreign interference.

Ontario is one of the most mineral rich areas in the entire world. This includes minerals such as nickel, titanium, cobalt and lithium which cell phones, computers, medical devices, energy and electric vehicles rely on.

Ontario's electricity grid is one of the cleanest in the world with a diverse supply mix made up of nuclear, hydroelectric, natural gas, wind, solar and bioenergy.

As part of its plan to protect Ontario, the province introduced the Protect Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act, 2025 on April 17, which would cut red tape and streamline approvals to speed up critical mineral and resource development projects, including in the Ring of Fire.

"The Government of Ontario's work in protecting our critical minerals and mining resources will help maintain and create high-quality jobs in Thunder Bay and Northwestern Ontario. As mining and energy development continue to drive growth, we look forward to the additional protections and safeguards which will help Ontario companies enhance our role as leaders in the mining and energy sectors."



Ontario Mine Rescue announces district finalists of 2025

Top mine rescue teams to compete for provincial title

As Ontario Mine Rescue District Competitions came to a close on May 9th, each of the eight districts celebrated their winning team during the evening ceremonies. The winners are expected to compete at the Provincial Competition in June, where only one team will return home with the coveted gold hard hats.

This year's district competition was packed with new and unexpected events – malfunctioning gear and last resort solutions during an active emergency kept competitors on their feet.

Teams began their scenario with a vehicle

crash blocking their way to a fuel bay on fire, no water available, and a casualty trapped by their seatbelt. Too hot to use a fire extinguisher, they worked quickly to free the casualty and pulled the vehicle out of the doorway. Once completed, a built-in fire suppression system activated and extinguished the fire, which allowed the team to search for the next casualty. However, they were still expected to use a fire extinguisher on a volatile fuel spill – while not the best method, it was necessary under the circumstances.

Aside from extinguishing fires and rescuing casualties, certain mine rescue volunteers are trained to troubleshoot, repair, and maintain breathing apparatus. These volunteers, known as Technicians, are





actively on standby during emergencies to service equipment. Technicians were called to action when the captain's breathing apparatus failed a basic field test at the start of the competition.

That doesn't mean all equipment is repairable on demand – it's natural for old technology to become obsolete, and parts discontinued. In the first aid section, teams faced yet another equipment failure and were forced to use an alternative breathing apparatus on their casualty. Their backup plan was a new open circuit breathing apparatus, known as the MSA G1. This firefighting staple, introduced

to volunteers in the Surface Mine Rescue program, is a viable way to transport casualties through dangerous environments.

"Even if we're prepared for any emergency, the least ideal solution could be the only one available," says Shawn Rideout, Chief Mine Rescue Officer at Workplace Safety North. "Paying attention to your surroundings, problem-solving under pressure, and adapting as the situation unfolds is critical in mine rescue work."

The familiar Half-Way Motors brand started in Thunder Bay in 1963 as a service station on Hodder Ave, originally selling Studebaker automobiles. Today in 2025, some 62 years later, they operate 5 distinct businesses including: Half-Way Motors Nissan, Half-Way Motors Mazda, Half-Way Motors Powersports, CarStar and Half-Way Motors Turf!

"There is still a service centre and a church in the old showroom on Hodder Ave. Over the beginning years we had Jeep when it was a stand alone brand, Fiat during it's first time in North America and Volvo as a primarily brand," said Patrick Trevisanutto, Managing Partner Half-Way Motors Group. "In 1968 the Japanese with Datsun were coming into North America and they started leaving vehicles at the Hodder Ave shop - 4 or 5 at that time. My grandfather, John, sold them all! The guy came back a couple weeks later and left some more. There was a lot more trust back them. We did that for about a year and in 1968 we officially became a Datsun dealer and are the third oldest continuously family owned Nissan dealer in Canada."

The Half-Way Group now have three new, expanded and renovated properties in the area of Memorial Ave and Carrick Street. It started with a brand new Car Star facility. Then they renovated a building for the Mazda image program moving into a better location to represent the brand a little stronger. Now next door Half-Way have added 7500 square feet to the Nissan store, updating to the current Nissan image program. Down the road on Carrick

Street is Half-Way Motors Powersports and Half-Way Motors Turf which sell BRP and John Deere products.

" Most manufacturers are global businesses and have standards that must be maintained, so they dictate what the building looks like, including the finishes. The old Nissan building wasn't very old, only 17 years, but we had outgrown it and the new image program was required. Ultimately it will allow us to serve our customers better. We are growing and have increased our sales over the years so Nissan looks at that and says you need a bigger building to facilitate this product. It is really a faith in us from them that we are going in the right direction with the brand." said Daniel Trevisanutto. Partner Half-Way Motors Group.

As Half-Way Motors Nissan sell more vehicles and get more customers a big portion of their expansion is additional shop space.

"Nobody wants to wait a week or longer to get their vehicle in for service, as it is an important part of their life to get to work, to get to their kids sports games, etc. Primarily the addition was additional shop space. We added additional hoists so we could bring in more technicians and have more customers. The service department moved into part of where the showroom was. We needed space to show cars inside because of the winter season here and rain. We also added two indoor delivery bays so someone can take delivery inside," said Patrick.

Half-Way Motors Nissan have a strong customer base in the Thunder Bay pri-

mary market, after 62 years of operation, but also can serve a broader basewith their unique geography area including Nipigon, Marathon and out to Dryden and Fort Frances. The nearest other Nissan dealers are at Sault Ste Marie or at Steinback near Winnipeg.

"We started this Half-Way Motors Nissan expansion with some ground work prep but it has only really been 11 months of renovation for us to get to where we are today. We have had great work from our contractor RML Contracting and the fantastic trades that really pulled together to get the job done in a timely fashion. As we have had to be working out of a trailer or temporary work locations it is nice to have the quickest time frame. Also it was harder on our customers to know where to go. We are looking at the end of May to be in mostly complete with some paving left to do." said Patrick Trevisanutto. "Our Half-Way team has risen to the occasion. Our service team had to work out of a trailer. Our sales team were out of the old Volvo building (which will be torn down to make way for more parking) so we tried to make the space work and have been able to service our customers the best we can."

"The new building will be fantastic to have everyone back in one facility and bring the team back together. It makes a big difference in servicing the customers when everyone is close together. It will be a more comfortable expe-



rience for the customers." said Daniel Trevisanutto.

I asked Patrick about whether US tariffs have affected the business operations?

"Tariffs have had a little effect on us, as some product is built in the US and being kept in the US. The only consistent is change over the last 5 years. We had Covid disruptions, then supply chain disruptions and now tariffs. At the end of the day you can't control it or change it so you have to deal with what we have and control what you can. It is easy to get bogged down in the noise and forget why we are here and that is to sell cars and service customers."

"Nissan is a global company and we do have product coming out of Japan including the Rogue, the Armada and the new electric vehicles. Some are built in Mexico- the all new Kicks, Sentra and Versa. We have the Pathfinder and our trucks built in the US so it is a mix."

"We haven't seen a sales push because of tariffs. January and February tend to

be slower periods of vehicle sales and then they increase March and April into the summer. We've seen the regular cyclical situation. There is some talk by people about tariffs, but for most people a vehicle purchase isn't impulsive, but well timed process.

"Thunder Bay, overall is a very stabile economy in the sense that we normally don't have a boom or bust. No boom or bust, so stable which is nice. We are a very diverse economy which allows for stability."

Patrick and Daniel are the third generation of the Half-Way Motors Group. They have another brother in sales at Nissan and their sister helps with administration.

NWMO issues RFP for Centre of Expertise

The Nuclear Waste Management Organization issued a request for proposals (RFP) to design its Centre of Expertise in the Township of Ignace.

The Centre of Expertise, which is expected to open in 2028, will be a multimillion-dollar investment and an important landmark and international destination in northwestern Ontario, serving as a hub for research and development, community engagement and knowledge sharing.

The NWMO is prioritizing local and Indigenous vendors in the evaluation criteria, on a sliding scale based on proximity to Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation and the Township of Ignace.

Specifically, the contract will be for the detailed design, construction drawings, technical specifications, and cost estimates for the Centre of Expertise.

An Indigenous Knowledge and Reconciliation framework will inform planning for the Centre. This framework is part of the NWMO's Reconciliation Action Plan and reflects our commitment to advancing Reconciliation.

The NWMO has been in discussions



with the Township of Ignace since 2019 about the design and use of the Centre. It will be home to a technical and social research program and a technology demonstration program that will display the entire process of packaging and placing the containers of used nuclear fuel in the repository.

The physical appearance of the Centre will take the surrounding environment into consideration.

The RFP is open to June 13, 2025, and the NWMO expects to award the contract in July.

"The Centre of Expertise will be home to hundreds of high-value jobs, will provide educational opportunities across the region, and is expected to attract Canadian and international visitors. This is one of the most tangible benefits and most exciting commitments made by the NWMO to the communities hosting the deep geological repository, and we can't wait to see it spring to life in the coming years."


Tanner Ulakovic- Number 86 Eh!

"It is a very expensive sport but we have really good sponsors who help us out. We put everything we can into the car our-






selves as well." said Tanner Ulakovic.
